So, maybe this Lent, instead of giving something up we should all take something up – maybe we should all just PAUSE. PAUSE and think before we hit reply, PAUSE and think before we type the message, PAUSE and think before we ‘share with our followers’. PAUSE and think about **the impact of our actions on others**.
