Put together a collage of these/ Find your favourite and explain why/ Find your favourite tree and photograph or draw it.</p>	<p>Go for a walk at home or whilst on holiday. Draw a map of the route you have taken. Make sure that you use appropriate symbols and give it a key so that other people could use it.</p>	<p>Label a map of England of counties that are important to you and why e.g. member of family or friends live there. Include the names of cities or towns in each county.</p> <p>Label a map of Europe with names of countries and capital cities. Can you learn them off by heart? Can you research their flags?
