



**Parent Guide: Remote Education Plans and Procedures for
The Fellowship of All Saints, Kirkby Overblow and North Rigton C.E. Primary Schools
From 1st October 2020**

**1A Individual Child or Member of a Family
Displaying Symptoms**

Please advise the school office if your child or another member of your immediate family in the same household is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms.

If your child or someone in your household has COVID-19 symptoms and is waiting for a test or the results of a test, please see the **48hr 'First Aid Kit for Learning'** which is on each class page of the school website. This **'First Aid Kit for Learning'** will help to support your child with their learning whilst they are awaiting a test result and will direct you to relevant tasks and activities which will support your child for their first few days off school. At this time, any completed work does not need sending into school or posting on Tapestry.

If the test result is **NEGATIVE** → your child then returns to school.

If the test result is **POSITIVE** → your child should not return to school for 10/14 days (please see the government guidance for further clarification, depending on individual circumstances).

Following a positive test result, your child will be provided with suitable learning based on the lessons taught in school that week. Your child will have access to teacher led introductions for English and Maths lessons, through videos on Tapestry. They will also be given a two week grid full of tasks relating to projects and wellbeing. Your child's Maths and English work can be uploaded to Tapestry for your teacher to give feedback on and they will do this as soon as they are able to, but please respect that they will still be busy teaching their classes.

If your child is too unwell to complete this work there is no pressure to do so – we just want them to get better. Your child will be fully supported by staff on their return to school.

The schools senior leadership team will provide a daily 'wellbeing check' via Microsoft Teams at 8.30am for all individual pupils who are not able to be back in school after the 48hr First Aid Kit for Learning period. This is an opportunity for school to check in with children/parents for 10 minutes each day.

2 Full Bubble/Class Closure

If guided by Public Health England or the DfE, a full bubble may need to close. In this case, all parents will be informed by the school office.

Your child will be provided with suitable learning based on the lessons that would have been taught in school that week. Your child will have access to teacher led introductions for English and Maths lessons, through videos on Tapestry on a daily basis, as well as being given a two week grid full of tasks relating to projects and wellbeing. Your child's completed Maths and English work should be uploaded to Tapestry for your teacher to give feedback on and they will do this within school hours.

Any teachers who are working remotely will provide a daily 'wellbeing check' via Microsoft Teams for all pupils who are part of a full bubble closure. The time of these calls will be directed by the class teacher on Tapestry. This is an opportunity for class teachers to check in with children/parents for 10 minutes each day.

1B Individual Child Instructed to Self-Isolate

There may be times that individual children are asked to self-isolate. This may be because they have had close contact with another person who has had a positive test result. This will be a decision which has been instructed by Public Health England.

If you are contacted and your child is instructed to self-isolate, please follow the same plan for any child who has a positive test result. Any learning from home will follow the same format and will be provided by your child's class teacher.

3 Whole School Closure

If guided by Public Health England or the DfE, the whole school may need to close. In this case, all parents will be informed by the school office.

Your child will be provided with suitable learning based on the lessons which would have been taught in school that week. Your child will have access to teacher led introductions for English and Maths lessons, on a daily basis, through videos on Tapestry as well as being given a two week grid full of tasks relating to projects and wellbeing. Any completed Maths and English work should be uploaded to Tapestry for your teacher to give feedback on (and they will do this within school hours).

Your child's class teachers will provide a daily 'wellbeing check' via Microsoft Teams for all pupils who are part of a whole school closure. The time of these calls will be directed by the class teacher on Tapestry. This is an opportunity for staff to check in with children/parents for 10 minutes.

As it is an important aspect of both our schools, Collective Worship assemblies will be uploaded to Tapestry by Mrs Andrews twice a week for you to enjoy at home as a family.

Please note:

- Please ensure you have all the necessary log in details for Tapestry so that you can access any remote learning. Please ask the school office if you need any support.
- Microsoft Teams will be used for the 'wellbeing checks'. This will be linked to the email address you have provided to school in terms of email correspondence.
