CHRISTMAS DATES AND ACTIVITIES

- **Tuesday 15th December** Christmas Party Day – please can children come to school in party clothes and bring their own **named** packed party lunch – no products containing nuts.
- **Wednesday 16th December** Christmas Jumper Day -please can children come to school in Christmas jumpers, if they don't have a Christmas Jumper, any Christmassy clothing or non-uniform will do. FONR will collect donations via a bucket on the playground or a Just Giving page, please do not bring any cash into school.
- **Wednesday 16th December** School Christmas Lunch. If your child normally has a packed lunch and would like to have a Christmas lunch this day, please logon to ParentPay to pay £2.40 by 1st December.
- **Friday 18th December** FONR Christmas Surprise Snow Day – details to follow

This year's Nativity will be filmed by the school staff and posted on Tapestry.

As part of our Covid Health and Safety Risk Assessment requires us to limit the number of items that come into school from home, we are not able to allow children to bring Christmas Cards and Presents into school for each other, as they would normally do. This year, as an alternative to children sending Christmas Cards to their friends, if you are able, we would like you to donate the money you would usually spend on cards to a charity. Each class will be deciding which charity they would like to support and when the decision has been made the class teacher will post it on Tapestry. This is entirely a voluntary charitable contribution but please - no cards into school.

I know some children and families also like to give cards and presents to staff members, as a thank you for their hard work during the term – this also cannot happen. If you wish to thank your class teacher, I know they would very much appreciate a heartfelt message on Tapestry or via email.
